**Publicity:** The convention is open to ALL WOMEN not only voting members, so please promote it in your local congregation. Presidents, encourage your women to attend and enjoy the fellowship of their Lutheran sisters. Included is a publicity poster and some bulletin blurbs to use as you wish.

**Registration:** A registration form and a scholarship form are included in this packet. Anyone who is not a voting member is considered a visitor on the registration form. **All registrations are due June 8, 2018.** Please make as many copies of the registration and scholarship forms as needed for your unit.

Voting Member: Each unit is allowed, and strongly encouraged, to have one voting member at the convention. Your voting member will be seated with all the other voting members from your conference. Your unit is expected to pay the expenses for your voting member. Voting Member orientation will be at 12:00 pm. Voting member registration is due June 8, 2018. If that voting member is unable to attend the convention, you may send someone else in her place. Voting members will be electing a president, treasurer, and 5 board members for 2-year terms.

**Scholarships:** Ten scholarships are available for those who have never attended a synodical convention. There is no age limit for these scholarships. The deadline to apply for a scholarship is **June 1, 2018**. The selected will be notified by **June 8, 2018**, at the latest. Our scholarship mentors will be Algene Larson from Donnelly and Karen Skarphol from Windom.

Speakers: We're excited to have Pastor Yolanda Denson-Byers lead our opening worship and Bible study. Pastor Dee Pederson from Bethlehem will lead our closing worship. Keynote speaker will be Dr. Jacqueline A. Bussie from Concordia College in Moorhead, MN. ### **2018 Convention Speaker**

Dr. Jacqueline Bussie is an author, professor, theologian, public speaker, and student of life in all its messy beauty. Her first book, *The Laughter of the Oppressed* (2007), won the national Trinity Prize. Her second book, *Outlaw Christian: Finding Authentic Faith by Breaking the Rules* (2016) won the 2017 Gold Medal Illumination Award for Christian Living. Her third book, *Love Without Limits: Jesus' Radical Vision for a Love with No Exceptions*, will be released in August 2018. An active servant-leader in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Dr. Bussie teaches religion, theology, and interfaith studies classes at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota, where she also serves as the Director of the Forum on Faith and Life. At our convention, she will speak on her award-winning book *Outlaw Christian*, and deliver a dynamic talk entitled *Outlaw Christians: Finding Authentic Faith by Breaking the Rules*.

### **Bible Study Leader & Opening Worship Preacher**

Reverend Dr. Yolanda Denson-Byers was born in St. Louis, Missouri. She was educated at Wesleyan and Harvard Universities, as well as Luther Seminary where she earned a Doctor of Ministry in congregational mission and leadership with special focus on hospice and bereavement ministries. Pastor Yolanda currently serves as a chaplain with St. Croix Hospice, serving much of central Minnesota. When she is not working, Pastor Yolanda enjoys spending time with her family, hiking, camping, reading books, writing poetry, and vacationing anywhere there is a salt water beach. She also enjoys opportunities for preaching and teaching in churches and denominations throughout the country.

**Bible Study Description:** In today's Bible study, we will discuss what it means to be a citizen of the Kingdom of Love in an age of contention. What are the laws and expectations of God's kingdom? How do these square with the law's expectations of the communities and world in which we live? What then does it mean to be an "Outlaw Christian?" Finally, how can we faithfully stand guard, full of courage and strength, as we seek to communicate God's love in as age of contention?

Executive Board Member Women of the Lutheran Evangelical Church of America

Kandy Pflaster was elected to the executive board of Women of the ELCA in July 2017. She serves on the board's programs and communication committee.

Previously, Kandy served as president, vice president and High Plains board representative for the Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization (4A). As part of her work with the Nebraska SWO and the Nebraska Synod Council, Kandy traveled to Nebraska's companion synods, Argentina and Tanzania, and



served on the Nebraska Synod Council rostered disciplinary committee.

Kandy was a voting member for the Nebraska synod at the ELCA churchwide assembly in 2005. She served on the Nebraska Synod Council as Women of the ELCA representative, and she was a triennial gathering promoter for the Tenth Triennial Gathering (2017).

Kandy is a resident of Cozad, Nebraska, the "hay capitol" of the state. She has lived in Nebraska her entire life and has been a member of American Lutheran Church in Cozad for about 30 years. She served as president of the women's unit and chair of the pastor call committee. She assembled the church member directory and is a lector.

She recently served eight years as a community-elected member of the Cozad Hospital Board and Cozad Hospital Foundation.

Kandy has a bachelor's degree in nursing and was director of nursing for a skilled nursing facility for 20-plus years. After a career change in 2007, she began working in surgery where she is now the charge nurse for surgery at Kearney Regional Medical Center. Her passion is working with surgeons and the operating staff in new surgical procedures.

Kandy and her husband, Tony, have three children and six grandchildren, all of whom live nearby. She enjoys spending time with her family and friends. She and her husband take an annual "Grandkid's Trip" with her grandchildren where no parents are allowed. Interests and hobbies include photography, cooking, camping, gardening, traveling and organizing events with friends or family.

### **Workshop Options for Saturday, June 30, 2018**


- \* Faithful Stewards. Lasting Impact: Please plan to attend "Faithful Stewards, Lasting Impact" discussion presented by Amy Bigot, Regional Gift Planner for the ELCA in the NW and SW Minnesota Synods. Faithful Stewards: Amy talks about being good stewards of the gifts that the Lord has given each of us, as everything we have comes from him. These gifts from God are a blessing to us in our lifetimes, but what about after we are gone? Have you considered how the gifts you've received throughout your lifetime may be a blessing to others? Lasting Impact: This overview presentation will get you thinking about the gifts you've received, and how your family, your heirs, AND Ministry can all benefit from these gifts. In her role as Gift Planner, Amy works with you to help maximize the distribution of your estate to your heirs, using tools that will save on income and inheritance taxes, AND help you support the ministries that have been important to you throughout your lifetime. Through your legacy plans you can make a lasting and meaningful impact in this world. What's the greatest possibility you can imagine God could do with your life story-now and beyond this life-that would bring joy and blessing to others? Amy's work is a service provided to you at no charge by the ELCA Foundation.
- \* Pursuing Your Passion: An uplifting and fun workshop by Marcy Prinz, who will share her motivation and journey on becoming a Christian Clown at the age of 45. Marcy hopes to inspire you to pursue your passion and energize your talents for ministry. For the past 19 years Marcy (Mousy the Christian Clown) has shared God's love and her gifts in churches, nursing homes, at Children's Hospital and in communities. She produced a Christian children's cable TV show and took her ministry to Russia and Honduras. Marcy is Pastor Linda Pedersen's sister-in-law.
- \* What Can We Do in Our Own Congregations About Human Traffickers and Other Predators: Our present culture gives manipulators through technology all kinds of access to our kids. If we wait for bad things to happen to them like being trafficked, being molested, getting into drugs and alcohol, into internet pornography, into an abusive marriage, it is too late. Every member of our congregations can be doing prayerful and wise work at the top of the cliff so one of our precious young people doesn't become a broken Humpty Dumpty. God is with us and has provided the tools and weapons we need to save our children. Come and discover what God has given us to work with. Presenter is Pastor Al Erickson who is the director of Adults Saving Kids which worked with SW MN SWO Women of the ELCA from 1995 to 2004. In 2007 he came to realize that we must get parents and grandparents involved if we are going to save our youth from the subtle, sophisticated tactics of those who would take advantage of their vulnerabilities. He has written books and other materials on <a href="www.parentsarise.org">www.parentsarise.org</a>. One of his daughters was a victim of trafficking. He has 6 children, 16 grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren. He and his wife, Ina, live in Richfield.

\*Presenter is **Anna Mercedes**, associate professor of theology at College of Saint Benedict/Saint John's University, where she also teaches gender studies. Anna is soon to be ordained as a minister of word and sacrament with the ELCA, and is a mother of three.

- 1. What is a resolution? A resolution is a main motion, presented in written form by a voting member a proposal that a convention takes action on, or expresses itself as holding certain views.
- 2. Who prepares and presents Resolutions? Every Congregational Unit has the right and privilege to prepare and present, through its voting member, a Resolution to the convention. The Resolution must be signed by five (5) voting members representing five (5) congregational units of the SW MN Synodical Women's Organization of Women of the ELCA.
- 3. Why do we use Resolution forms? The form helps the secretary and president accurately report the business and action taken, it helps you think through your motion and it helps the convention move forward in an orderly manner.
- 4. Resolutions are your voice. If you want to speak up and be heard, this is one way of expressing yourself. Resolutions provide for the vision and direction of our organization. If you have an area of concern that you feel needs to be addressed, a resolution is a way of requesting action and beginning discussion and deliberation. The beginning portion of the resolution (the WHEREAS) states the issue of concern and should list factual background information to help the reader understand why this resolution is being presented. The conclusion (the RESOLVED) states the proposed action or actions. It tells what you think we should do about this issue.

#### Ask yourself these questions before submitting a Resolution:

- 1. Is the concern something our SW MN Synodical Women's Organization can address?
- 2. Is the proposed action consistent with the positions and policies of the ELCA?
- 2. What is the outcome desired if the action is taken?
- 3. In what other ways might congregational units of our Synodical Women's Organization deal with the concerns?
- 4. What are the costs in terms of time, talent, and money in implementing this action?

If after reviewing the guidelines, you wish to submit a Resolution, write it on the official form that is included in this publicity packet to your congregational unit.
