There are many details to plan yet on this schedule, but we

hope this gives you an idea of what to expect. Invitations will be sent to all Ordained Women Pastors in our synod (including retired women pastors) so that we can make it a day of honoring these wonderful women in our lives!

So are you all busy making the Walker Bags? Be sure to bring the completed bags with you to the SWO Convention on May 2<sup>nd</sup> in Redwood Falls. The synod women's board will pass the bags onto the Synod Assembly (June 12 & 13, 2020 at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter). The bags will be filled with items at synod assembly and then distributed to local care centers where there is a need.

The election this time will consist of electing a synod president; synod treasurer and five board members at large. Please keep the synod nominating committee in your prayers as they faithfully seek out women to fill the ballot to be elected in May. The newly elected and present synod board will be installed at convention as well as the triennial voting members that are attending Triennial at Phoenix in July of this year.

Speaking of Triennial – an e-mail went out to those who have signed up to receive information on the 2020 Triennial. It would be nice for the synod board to know who is actually attending the Gathering. We know the ten voting members that are attending the Convention, but we are not sure of those who are actually attending the Gathering. So if you could let me know if you plan to attend the Gathering in Phoenix that would be very helpful. Just because you signed up to receive information doesn't mean you are planning to attend. We have had a couple ladies back out of their plans to attend, so please let me know ASAP if you are attending the Gathering. NOTE: Even if you did not sign up on the triennial interest list and you are attending the Gathering we still need to know this. As of December 1, 2019 we have 46 signed up.

The hotel reservation information was e-mailed out in October 2019. If you have not already registered for your Gathering hotel room, please let me know that as well. If you are rooming with someone during the Gathering only ONE of the roommates needs to register the hotel room. If you have questions on this process - please feel free to get ahold of me or Pat Stevermer soon!

The synod board is working on the SW MN ID items for Triennial as well as the Give-Away items we'll take with to Phoenix. You'll be informed as to the decision on these items and any cost involved.

With time limitations at our convention in May, the board has decided that our promoter, Pat Stevermer, will be at the Triennial Display Table and will have information to hand out to those attending Triennial. If there is still a need of some or all the Triennial attendees to meet at the end of the convention day that can be arranged, but there is no other Triennial Meeting planned. We are hoping to do most of this informative process through e-mail.

There will be a **Scholarship Program** offered once again at

The 2019 Leadership Event was successful and we enjoyed having the 81 Conference Officers and Synod Board in attendance. FYI: The 2020 Leadership Event will be held Saturday, August 22, 2020 at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Redwood Falls, so mark your calendars!

The 2019 Conference Falls Gatherings were well attended. The variety of programs and speakers were enjoyed by all who attended! Thank you to the conference boards for planning and preparing the events! A couple of changes were decided on by a couple conferences. Watonwan River Conference voted to hold just ONE Gathering – the Spring Gathering starting in 2020. Due to lower numbers of active women in the units and hosting churches it was decided to drop the Fall Gatherings and go with just one event. Scenic Valley has always met in the evenings on a Thursday for years – they decided to try something new starting in 2020. Their Spring Gatherings will still be held in

the evenings, but they are going to try their Fall Gatherings on a Saturday morning.

I've received word that St. Paul's Lutheran of Arlington (Minnesota Valley Conference) has disbanded their local WELCA unit. Two other Units have been dropped due to votes by their congregations to leave the ELCA. We've lost Bethany Lutheran WELCA at Storden and Trinity Lutheran WELCA at Jeffers (both of these were in the Shetek Conference).

The Speaker's List for our synod women's organization will be updated at our January 18th board meeting, so if you have some ideas of possible speakers please get all the information to Christina Nelson ASAP! Once the updates are done the complete Speakers List will be posted on the synod women's website.

I ask for your prayers for synod board member at large, Louise Ferry and her family. Louise's significant other, Dale Geske (74), passed away at his Benson MN home Oct. 23, 2019. Blessed be the memory of Dale.

## Mission Action/Stewardship

The Parable of the Rich Fool in Luke, chapter 12, tells the story of a wealthy farmer who was blessed with an abundant crop. The man thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' He then decided to tear down his old barns and build larger ones to store all his grain and his goods. Verse 19 – 21 continues the parable, "And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

Being from an agricultural family and area, this parable has always bothered me a little from the practical standpoint. You have a huge crop; you have to store it somewhere; you can't just leave it out in the elements to spoil. You have to take care of what you have and prepare for the future, right? That's just good stewardship.

Recently, I heard a sermon on this text that put things in a context I hadn't thought of before; the Rich Fool's problem is that he made his decisions and plans alone; the whole parable is framed in the context of the Rich Fool talking to himself; he is not including his family or his neighbors. Presumably, it was a good year and everyone had a good crop. Maybe the man, his family, and the community could have worked together to build resources for the future, to preserve and build upon their good fortune and to share with those who had less.

In this story, the Rich Fool's self-absorbed plans came to

nothing, and he didn't have the forethought to make a plan on what would happen to assets. He thought only of himself, not in terms of generosity toward God and his neighbors. How different the story could have been if, upon harvesting the bumper crop, the community would have joined together to come up with a plan to best grow and share their bounty.

Our Women of the ELCA Purpose Statement begins, "As a community of women..." Working together, we can achieve amazing results. One of the ways this is most visible is in our Mission Action projects. Together, the quilts and kits from Southwest Minnesota can fill the back of a semi. Our labors of love can provide comfort and health to hurting people.

This year, our Mission Action focus is Personal Care Kits. To those of us living in abundance, it may be just a bar of soap, a towel, a toothbrush. To the survivor of a disaster or to a refugee, a Personal Care kit is acknowledgement of the recipient's humanity, as well as a potentially health or lifesaving gift. Closer to home, another mission this year is creating Walker/Wheelchair bags. We ask that you bring the bags to Spring Convention, and they will be filled with goodies and useful items at the Synod Assembly and distributed. You may have received a pattern for making the Walker/Wheelchair bags at your Fall Gathering or other WELCA event, or you can find patterns on Pinterest.

Living in a college town, there is often the opportunity to hear speakers coming to campus to shed light on controversial topics. Last November, guest speaker, Lori Paul from the organization **Breaking Free** gave a presentation, "The Dark Side Of Sex Industry" to students and community members in Marshall at Southwest Minnesota State University.

Breaking Free is an organization in St. Paul, Minnesota that helps women escape prostitution and sexual exploitation. They also help end the demand, by helping men who have been caught purchasing women. Breaking Free is a non-profit organization, working for justice and social change, founded by Vednita Carter in 1996.

Ms. Paul spoke to the students at SMSU about ways to help people who are hurting and ways to combat a growing problem in today's society. Pornography is a big driver of the sex trafficking industry. She talked about the pornography industry growing by \$85 billion in a recent five-year study (2012-2017). In the past, a typical buyer of a prostitute was a "a 40 year-old-white guy, married with kids, no more--now it is an 18 -19 year old." There is easy access to pornography on phones now a days and it provides a rush to the brain—dopamine, which is like heroin and cocaine and can become an addiction. Resulting in an obsession to seek more, next time purchasing sex.

In last month's edition of Women of the ELCA- *BOLD Connections*, an article was written about <u>Recognizing Gender Violence</u>. The article stated we can only make a difference by talking about this issue and doing our best to let women and girls know that we will not accept abuse. The UN-sponsored International Day to End Violence Against Women was held this

past November 25th. The day kicked off the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence, an international campaign that ran until Dec. 10 (Human Rights Day), inviting individuals and groups to mobilize and call for the elimination of violence against women and girls. A worldwide goal for 2030 is to end violence against women and is a calling for all of us to take our boldest stand yet against rape. How can we help on a local level in our communities? Small actions can make big impacts to stamp out rape culture. Find stories, infographics and action ideas that you can share to make a difference wherever you are. Visit www.unwomen.org. Use the color orange and join the conversation on social media using #orangetheworld and #generationequality. Visit www.breakingfree.net to see\_how you can help with outreach opportunities. There are speakers available to come to your next gathering to share a faith-based perspective.

Spend some time researching this area of injustice, to learn more about specific ways you can personally help right the wrongs involved, from volunteering with or donating to an advocate like **Breaking Free**. Humble yourself before God, interceding in prayer for women and girls suffering from sexual violence. Asking Him to keep teaching you more about other people's needs and strengthening your ability to see them from the right perspective.

Best advice that Lori Paul shared with the SMSU students," Be loving, caring and kind to each other."

Fight injustice with LOVE.

## Mission Growth/Discipleship
