During this seasonal time, I keep returning to the words of Ecclesiastes chapter 3.

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill an a time to heal. a time to tear down and a time to build. a time to weep and a time to laugh. a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend. a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace."


