

### A Message from Pastor Heather

As we come to the fall season, we begin to focus on new beginnings and learning. College students load up their cars to head off for new se-

mesters of discoveries and adventures. School supplies have been in the stores since July, getting everyone ready for the start of a new school year. Sunday school lessons and plans are being finalized. Sometimes, we might be tempted to think that all this focus on learning is simply for the children and youth in our lives, but as people of faith, we continue to learn throughout our lives about God and our world.

A desire to learn more about God and the world around us is an echo throughout the Psalms, as God's people pray: "Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths." (Psalm 25:4) Again in the Psalms, God's people ask for God to teach them, praying: "Teach me your way, Lord, that I may rely on your faithfulness; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name." (Psalm 86:11)

Jesus throughout his life taught people about who God was and what God's kingdom would be like. From the time he was just a young person teaching in the Temple, to the times he taught his small group of disciples, to the times he taught large crowds that gathered around him, Jesus was a teacher. Jesus taught through stories called parables. He taught his disciples how to pray. He taught the crowds lessons like the beatitudes. Those who followed Jesus learned from him. Then Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be our teacher, as Jesus says: "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." (John 14:26)

Learning is a part of our faith lives as Christians. As we enter this fall season, what are you wanting to learn? A new hobby? A new language? How are you going to keep learning and growing in faith? Maybe you'll continue going to WELCA Bible studies. Maybe you'll pick a book to read that stretches your perspectives. ### Mission Community/Justice

"The Cold Within" is a poem written in the 1960's by American poet Patrick Kinney.

According to the poet's widow, he submitted it first to the Saturday Evening Post, but it was rejected as it was "too controversial" for the time.

The poem gives a strong message against racial discrimination. It is a simple but powerful reminder that if we selfishly hold on to world's resources, and the wealth offered by it, and we persist in discrimination on grounds of race, religion, caste, gender and ethnicity, we are all lost.

The message Kinney gives is that harboring prejudices against each other will ultimately prove fatal, the poem teaches how in today's generation prejudices, malices, biases, discriminations and racisms can destroy human beings and eventually the world.

Six humans trapped by

In bleak and bitter cold.

Each one possessed a stick of wood Or so the story's told.

Their dying fire in need of logs,

But the first man held his back.

### Mission Growth/Discipleship

Occasionally people are called to extraordinary discipleship. Abraham and Sarah. Moses. Esther. Almost everyone is called to uncommon faith and obedience sometime in life. A child dies, a spouse leaves, a job is lost, or the diagnosis is bleak.

But most discipleship is ordinary and mundane. Most of the time, discipleship is getting up each day and trying to make the best of it. Our spiritual lives, we may feel, are boring or trivial, quite unlike those of people with "real callings."

The words "disciple" and "discipleship" are first cousins to "discipline." I know (and so do you) some people whose lives have been shaped by the discipline of following Jesus. Because they practice, these disciples make it look easy, even though it isn't. Their lives, molded by Christ's own, have warmed and brightened mine.

### Mission Action/Stewardship

If you've grown up in a Christian church or participated in a Bible Study, chances are you've heard the term stewardship and have some idea what it means. Typically, the first thought we have is that it means tithing or relates to our finances. I believe that is true but not the whole story. To me, good stewardship is carefully managing what God gave you to serve.

**To Serve Others** As it says in 1 Peter 4:10-11, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." In this example good stewardship means using your gifts to serve others. The writer then continues and lists ways you could serve, "If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides..." We were all created differently and given different abilities. Some of us are better at encouragement, while others possess the gift of teaching. Both are needed along with many other gifts and very rarely do you see people who are gifted with everything. No matter what you've been given, it's important to use these gifts to help those around you.

**To Serve God** From the parable of talents found in Matthew 25:14-30, we find a lesson on serving God. In the parable, each servant is given an amount of talents or gold based on their ability. The servants who used their talent to produce more were admonished, and the one who buried their talent was criticized. The message is clear, don't waste the talents given to you by the master.

It doesn't matter how much talent you have; all that matters is that you use it. Again this looks different for different people, but if you've been given a certain skill, then there's probably an area that skill can be used.
